

The second cabinet will hold big two-man saws, displayed vertically with sickles. Top of case across from saws - photo of threshing at Dirksmeyer's farm on Packard Avenue. Several additional photos: P. Welbes' house and family and Sam Sexton's house. Artifacts displayed on shelves: stories of people buried at Lake Protestant Thompson Cemetery. Bottom of display case - farming implements, horse collar, kerosene lamp holder, wooden rolling pin, washboard, irons, sewing machine, old shoes with metal shoe forms, Drehfal clay marbles, old coins and Cornwall pipes.
