Old World Wisconsin = Ski through History

Old World Wisconsin is open for crosscountry skiing every Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, from December 27, 1986 to March 8, 1987, snow conditions permitting.

More than eight miles of carefully groomed and marked trails, graded for beginning, intermediate and advanced skiiers, wind through nearly 600 acres of rolling, wooded hills in the southern unit of Kettle Moraine State Forest. The trails take skiers past many of the site's historical structures and ethnic farmsteads. Two of the buildings are open to the public. An 1896 schoolhouse serves as a heated reststop where hot and cold drinks may be purchased. The Clausing Barn Restaurant is open for lunch and until 6 pm on Saturdays and Sundays.

Old World Wisconsin is operated by the State Historical Society of Wisconsin. It is located on Hwy 67, about 35 miles southwest of Milwaukee and 55 miles southeast of Madison.
