Born: 1821/2

Note: Edward served with the 24th Wisconsin Regiment in the Civil War

Children of Edward and Laura:

Laura divorced Edward on May 13, 1879

Second Marriage: William Henry Harrison Burr on October 20, 1879. W. H. Burr; son of Joseph Brown and Sarah Ann – nee: Bush; born June 8, 1840 in Burlington County, New Jersey. In 1859, at the age of 19 years, he moved with his family to Milwaukee. He became Milwaukee's leading tailor, and was referred to as "Billy Burr the Tailor".

The Burrs lived in Milwaukee until 1883, then moved to Appleton, Wisconsin, then settled in Janesville, Wisconsin in 1885. There were no children born to William and Laura.

After William's death, Laura E. Burr lived in her son Harry R. Day's home in Janesville until her death, at age 79, on May 2, 1921.

November 4, 1836 in Fort Dearborn (Village of Chicago)

Settled in Milwaukee's Bay View area in 1836.

Elijah Estes is believed to be the first settler of Bay View in 1835. Elijah's son Colomar who is also buried in the Lake Protestant Cemetery, was the first Mayor of Bay View. Elijah was one of the first trustees of the Village of Bay View and was fellow Justice of the Peace with Jared Thompson II at the time of the Sebastopol disaster.

Elijah Estes, his wife Zebiah Wentworth Estes, and three of their children are buried in Thompson Cemetery (Lake Protestant Cemetery).
