


The subject of this presentation:

Bernard Isaac Durward, a professor, poet, and painter, immigrated to America in 1845. The Wisconsin State Historical Society commissioned Durward to paint portraits of Solomon Juneau, Byron Kilbourn, and Bishop Henni. A keen friendship with Bishop Henni led Durward to convert to Catholicism.

Durward soon joined the St. Francis DeSales Seminary on South Lake Drive, as a professor of rhetoric and English. He still painted, with the professorship supplementing his income.

In 1862, the Durward family moved to a property in Baraboo, Wisconsin, which the family named Durward's Glen. Here Durward devoted himself to painting religious subjects and spending time on his writing and poetry.
